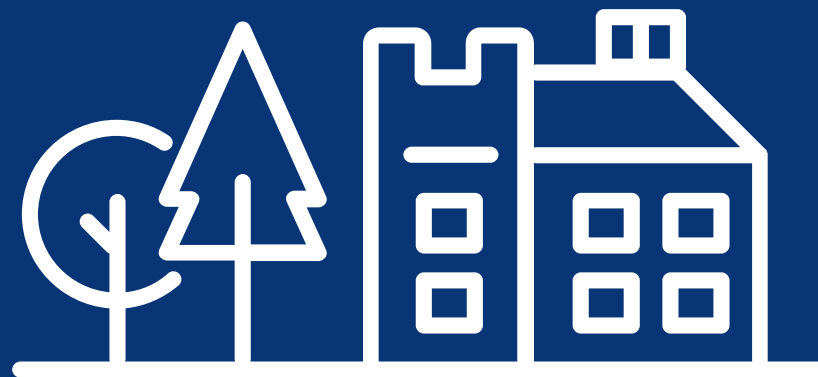

Getting out and about

Overlooking the beautiful and unspoilt trees and grasslands of Durdham Down, Cote Lane offers a calm haven away from city life. And yet, take a short stroll and you're once again back in the hustle and bustle of leafy suburban communities.



Close to Cote Lane, the village suburbs of Henleaze and Westbury-on-Trym each have an excellent selection of shops, cafés, bars and restaurants. For a larger selection of stores including many well-known high street favourites, Bristol's regional shopping centre, The Mall at Cribbs Causeway, is also within easy reach.

A ten minute drive from Cote Lane and you're in the vibrant and cultural centre of Bristol itself. Famous for its historic harbourside, museums, art galleries, theatres, music and festivals. Bristol is also a renowned for its excellent, multicultural food scene, with restaurants catering for every type of taste imaginable.

Whether it's shopping for a special gift, trying a new restaurant, exploring the harbourside, or enjoying a night of music or theatre, Bristol has its own, unique unmistakable identity.

Cote Lane has excellent transport links with buses stopping right outside which will take you directly into the heart of the city or to the regional shopping centre at Cribbs Causeway. For travel further afield the motorway network is just 4 miles away, offering easy access to the Midlands, London, the South West and Wales. Trains to all parts of the UK run from the mainline train station at Bristol Temple Meads. And for travel to Europe and beyond, Bristol International Airport is 10 miles from Cote Lane to the south of the city.



Spiritual well-being

Cote Lane was the founding site of the St Monica Trust when it was formed in 1920. The brainchild of Mary Monica Wills who wanted to create a rest home for older people with a 'splendid and very beautiful chapel' at its heart. That chapel is the magnificent St Augustine's which is the focal point for spirituality at Cote Lane.

Spiritual well-being is important for many residents and is supported by St Monica Trust's own chaplain and pastoral care team. Available for all, regardless of faith, belief or religion, the team arrange opportunities for regular worship. Together with the village manager and village engagement co-ordinator, they play a pivotal role within village life ensuring everybody's well-being is being enriched and nurtured.

The pastoral care team can also offer emotional support during difficult or challenging times – listening, comforting and supporting both residents and their family members.



Safe, secure and stress-free

Everything at Cote Lane is designed to make enjoying life as easy as possible. Relax and focus on what matters to you, knowing there are a host of services available to help eliminate the stresses and strains of everyday life.

Safe and sound

One of the key benefits of living in a retirement village is the feeling of security. Door entry systems, CCTV and staff on-site 24 hours a day all help to make everyone feel safe and secure. If you're away from your home these same systems will give you peace of mind as you enjoy a holiday or visit family. Every apartment is also fitted with a discreet emergency call system to give residents peace of mind on a daily basis.

Clean and tidy

Our team of housekeepers can clean your home for you and if you'd like your laundry done, we can take care of that too. Half an hour of housekeeping is included each week, but additional help is available if required at extra cost.



Inside and out

Our estates team ensure Cote Lane remains immaculate and well-maintained. Should you encounter any problems within your apartment these can be easily notified so repairs can take place. And if you'd like help with any odd jobs around the home such as fixing shelves, hanging pictures or moving large deliveries just let the team know. The gardening team takes pride in all the outside spaces, ensuring the flowerbeds, parklands and gardens of Cote Lane look their best throughout each season of the year.

A site steeped in history

The foundation and vision of St Monica Trust dates back to a conversation around a family sundial in Wrington, North Somerset. It was here that Mary Monica Wills first spoke of her desire to buy a small rest home for ‘five or six missionary friends’.



That was in 1911 and over the ensuing years, Mary's original idea grew in scale.

Unfortunately the First World War slowed progress, but in 1919 Mary's husband, Henry Wills, identified the Cote House estate, in

Westbury, as the perfect site for the home. Following its purchase the area was cleared and building work began. Being a committed High Church Anglican, Mary was determined that a 'splendid and very beautiful chapel' should be

at the heart of the development. Priority was given to the building of the new chapel and the foundation stone was laid on St Monica's Day, May 4, 1920. Five years later, in 1925, the St Monica Home of Rest was completed.

Fast forward a century and Mary's vision has grown into the modern St Monica Trust we see today. We're committed to communities where older people flourish.

A replica of the Wills' family sundial, around which those first conversations took place, sits in the scented garden at Cote Lane. It is inscribed with the Wills' family motto: '*tempus fugit, caritas manet*' (time flies, love remains). A beautiful sentiment that is as true to the Trust today as it was back then.
